Based on Bennett, page 52, exercise 15: Take the Biblical Hebrew paradigm on p. 81. Focus on the Perfect "tense" (a.k.a. past tense or suffix conjugation).

- 1. Compare the personal suffixes (subject markers) in the "no object" column to the personal suffixes in other Semitic languages (other pages in "Paradigms B").
- 2. Try to come up with hypothetical proto-Semitic forms.
- 3. Then do the same with the object suffixes.
